Conference: LogCon 2011

Regional Asset Database Project (RADP)

The RADP Survey was issued via email to project jurisdictions to assess the overall resource cataloging needs of the jurisdictions. The NJ OEM is assisting in the survey distribution and collection effort for project jurisdictions in New Jersey. The completed survey is due on January 31st. The Regional Logistics Program will analyze all responses and notify interested jurisdictions of next steps. The survey results will indicate the type and amount of support needed in the region's jurisdictions. Concept of Operations (CONOPS)

A CONOPS planning team meeting was held on Thursday, January 13th. During the meeting the final draft of the *CONOPS Playbook* was presented to the team. This draft is now in the last stages of completion and will be presented to the RCPT in the next few months. This presentation will mark the completion of the *CONOPS Playbook* deliverable.

Intermodal Infrastructure Reports: Air, Rail, Waterway, and Trucking

This month, the air and rail infrastructure reports were issued to jurisdictions that returned signed confidentiality agreements. For information on how to access your jurisdiction's report, please contact Jim Penta at jpenta@regionalcatplanning.org.

The Program Team is currently reviewing proposals submitted by vendors for the Waterway Task Order released last month. This task order calls for an assessment of the capacity of regional waterway infrastructure to transport freight after a catastrophic incident. A similar task order calling for an assessment of trucking infrastructure will be released to vendors within the month.

Area Logistics Emergency Response Teams (ALERT)

The ALERT Concept Paper was the topic of discussion during the ALERT planning team meeting on January 26th. With the assistance of the planning team, the ALERT concept has developed into one that allows for greater operational and deployment flexibility. During the planning team meeting, members reviewed the updated proposed training program and offered their feedback on the expanded dispatch courses under consideration. In addition, the team also discussed the different types of agreements that may be necessary for potential ALERT responders and their managers. The next ALERT planning team meeting will take place on **February 22nd at 1400**.

Commodity Distribution Point (CDP)

Due to inclement weather, the CDP planning team meeting was rescheduled for Thursday, January 27th. At this meeting, the planning team will review the revisions to part two of the draft *CDP Plan* and discuss the appropriate trigger time for CDP activation currently stated in part one. Additional discussions will focus on the most appropriate plan titling: Commodity Distribution Point (CDP), Point of Distribution (POD), or Commodity Point of Distribution (C-POD).

The formatted *CDP Field Operations Guide (CDP FOG)* has been reviewed by the project lead and feedback is being incorporated.

Staging Area/Receiving and Distribution Center

On January 20th, the planning team met and reviewed the initial sections of the *Receiving and Distribution Center (RDC) FOG*. The discussion at the planning team meeting focused on how best to build the RDC organizational structure and create a framework that will be of use to the region.

The planning team has now reviewed sections of the *FOG* covering its introductory materials, command structure, and operations section. Logistics Planner Alexander Marks will continue to draft the remaining sections of the FOG for an in-person presentation to the planning team at the RIC in mid-March.

Credentialing

A credentialing planning team meeting was held on Thursday, January 20th. During this meeting the final draft of the *Credentialing Annex* was presented to the planning team. This draft is now in the last stages of completion and will be presented to the RCPT in the next few months. This presentation will mark the completion of the Credentialing Annex deliverable.

Regional Resource Management Solution (RRMS)

At the close of last month, the NJ OHSP and NYC OEM expressed interest in both adopting the EDXL-RM standard within their respective jurisdictions and undertaking pilot demonstrations of the UICDS and IPAWS-OPEN platforms. These two agencies remain engaged in demonstrating the use of each platform, respectively. The agencies have offered to share their insights, successes, and lessons-learned with the planning team as they endeavor to benefit from these two federally developed solutions.

In addition, on the last planning team call, participants benefited from a presentation on the EDXL suite of standards given by Don McGarry, a representative from the MITRE Corporation. The MITRE Corporation is a not-for-profit corporation that has been funded by DHS to provide assistance to local and state agencies considering adoption of the various tools and solutions developed by the federal government. As a follow-up to some of the discussion items, RIMS planning team coordinators Alexander Marks and Michael Schultz met with Mr. McGarry to discuss opportunities for future collaboration that would greatly enhance data-visibility and interoperability across the region.

Next steps for the RIMS planning team continue to evolve based on new information and leads. The next planning team meeting will take place in late February.

Website

Vendor proposals for the Program website are currently under review. Website development will commence soon.

Volunteers and Donations Management Annex (VDMA)

On January 4th, the VDMA planning team met and reviewed the latest document in the VDM Guidance Suite: the *EOC Guidance Document*. The EOC Guidance Document is designed for use by the EOC personnel who will support volunteer and donations management during a catastrophic incident. Planning team members provided feedback during the meeting and throughout the month of January. With these comments, the VDM Guidance Suite remains on track for full planning team review at the next planning team meeting on **February 23rd**.
